Months after announcing financial struggles, the Boys and Girls Club in Franklin County will be getting a boost in spirits and funds through a talent show this Saturday.

Dedrick Williams and Terrance Alston have been working to launch a clothing line, Ambitious Rebirth by Nightmare Entertainment, and while doing so, Williams has served as an activity leader at the Boys and Girls Club site in Louisburg.

In that capacity, he has seen first hand the needs of this community's youth.

Figuring it would be a good opportunity to generate interest in the clothing line and help the club, both entities have organized the talent show.

Those are the main reasons that Banner agreed to be part of the talent show and fundraiser.

"This event is important to me because the children are our future," he said. "I want to inspire people to shoot for success at a young age and that's what the Boys and Girls Club is all about.

"I have always been a supporter of the Boys and Girls

Club," he said. "Over the years, I have been a part of

many initiatives with pro athletes and other radio personalities to speak with and encourage the youth.

The talent show will feature performers in a variety of disciplines, dancing, to singing to poetry.

"There will be all kinds of talent from our group, as well as local talent," Williams said. "They will get to show off what they can do and have a good time."

Admission is \$5 for the 6 p.m. event and each person will receive a raffle ticket, good for a chance to win a backpack stocked with school supplies.
